Vienna Philharmonic Coins



The Vienna Philharmonic – a Story of Success

Since 10 October 1989, the day the Vienna Philharmonic came into being, we have remained true to the coin's original design. Crafted with exquisite precision, the motif has always remained the same, with only the minting year changing. Since the very first edition, one side of the coin has featured a collection of instruments from the famous Viennese orchestra – a Vienna horn, a bassoon and a harp, with a cello in the centre and a viola and violin on either side. The other side depicts the organ in the Great Hall of the Musikverein concert hall in Vienna.

For some time now, the Vienna Philharmonic has also been available in silver, weighing 1 ounce, and in platinum. Available in both 1 ounce and 1/25 ounce, the Vienna Philharmonic in platinum makes an excellent alternative investment to the gold coin and has no cause to shun comparison.

Minted Bars



Similar to bullion coins, blank gold bars are stamped in a coining press with the bar markings and the desired bar motif. Minted bars are sold in blister packs.

Cast Bars

In the case of Cast bars, the molten gold granulate is poured into a bar mould. Once the bars have cooled, they are hallmarked, meaning that the inscription is stamped into the metal surface.
